The Conference/Meeting will be held at the charming Stoney Creek Hotel, 18011 Bass Pro Drive, Independence, MO.

The basic room is for two (2) queen beds for \$109 per night, not including tax and incidentals. This rate is comparable to others in the area. We reserved a number of rooms – they are going fast! So, if you want to stay at Stoney Creek, please make your plans soon. In the event we run out of rooms, there are several other nice hotels in the immediate area. We chose this location because it is near the Midwest Genealogy Center, i.e., our library affiliate, so if you choose to stay elsewhere, you may want to look for other hotels near the library.
